TRAINING REPORT



Training Report December 2021



According to the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, police are expected to be more proactive and strive to prevent crime, while building relationships within the community. This is a delicate balance that is difficult to achieve and maintain. To that end, police training involves more than knowing how to pat down someone that's detained, or how to shoot a gun, it's also about listening to people, watching for trends, and preparing for outcomes. SARPD Officers maintain a high level of moral and ethical values, and will continue to achieve this through training and education.

Training

December 6st – 8th - Officers Chica and Britt attended the Penn State Safety and Justice training titled "FTO Program". Officers Chica and Britt will now be assisting the training unit in providing professional training to new police recruits.

December 7th - Officer Tyler Mitchell attended the "Below 100" training class at the Allentown Police Academy. "Below 100" is an officer safety and survival course, focusing on the initiative to reduce police line-of-duty deaths to fewer than 100 per year. This training covers the real facts of how line-of-duty deaths are occurring across the country and what can be done to address the problem.

December 14th - members of the SARPD SWAT Team conducted movement training. Members that were in attendance, included Officers Labar, Macedo, Cohowicz, Knowles and Cpl. Petrosino, Cpl. Miller and Sgt. Brown.

HIRING UPDATE!!!!

On November 16th, 2021, SARPD conducted a Police Officer Recruit Exam, to create an eligibility list for hiring in 2022. Out of 73 applicants, 63 participated in the written exam and total of 34 applicants passed with a score of 70% or higher. The physical ability test was held on December 11th, 2021 at the Koehler Fieldhouse, on the grounds of East Stroudsburg university. 25 applicants attended the Physical Ability test, and 2 failed the test. The remaining 23 applicants proceeded on to the oral interview phase of the hiring process.

The Oral Exams were scheduled for December 20th and 21st. One candidate withdrew from the Oral Exam, prior to the exam. The final hiring list containing 22 applicants was certified at the December 23rd Special Commission Meeting. At the meeting, three candidates were given conditional offers of employment. Two candidates accepted, and began the academy on January 3, 2022. Due to the short period of notice, and other unforeseen circumstances, one candidate withdrew from the conditional offer and requested to be put back on the list and considered for the July Police Academy Class.

The SARPD congratulates applicants Kenneth Malarik and Wyatt Clements for their successful completion of all tests and requirements for employment and looks forward to them successfully completing the Allentown Police Academy. We look forward to welcoming them both into the department as fully sworn police officers in July 2022!

DETECTIVE UNIT REPORT December 2021

For the Month of December 2021, the Detective Unit was involved in several activities within the member municipalities of Stroud Township and the Boroughs of Stroudsburg and East Stroudsburg.

Details of some of these activities follow:

MAJOR CRIMES ASSAULTS

For the month of December 2021, 4 aggravated assaults were reported to the Stroud Area Regional Police Department.

- 2 occurred in Stroudsburg Borough
- 1 occurred in Stroud Township
- 1 occurred in East Stroudsburg Borough

The four reported aggravated assaults were responded to by Patrol Units with three cases requiring an immediate arrest due to the emergent circumstances. These cases involved a domestic incident, a stolen vehicle in which an officer was assaulted while making the arrest and a hit and run/DUI case in which the officer was assaulted after making the arrest. The remaining assault is still under investigation by the Patrol Division

SEX & FAMILY CRIMES

For the month of December 2021, 19 new sex crimes and possible child abuse cases were reported to the Stroud Area Regional Police Department, 15 cases were referred to the Detective Unit for further investigation.

There have been **56** physical and/or sexual child assaults referred to the Detective Unit within the last three months. The cases have been assigned to all Detectives as the referrals are received. The Detective's work consistently with Monroe County Children & Youth Agency in addition to the Monroe County Children's Advocacy Center in addition to the Monroe County District Attorney's Office.



In relation to the above assigned cases 11 were sex crimes, and 8 were suspected child abuse cases.

Of the 15 cases referred to the Detective Unit subsequently 12 cases remain under investigation and 3 cases have been closed.

In the majority of these open cases, the alleged perpetrators are known or have been identified through investigation. The investigations are still ongoing to determine if an actual crime was committed and if so to establish enough probable cause to make an arrest. Due to the nature of these crimes and/or the age of the victims no further information can be released at this time.

ROBBERY

For the month of December, 2021 the Stroud Area Regional Police Department received one report of Robbery.




On December 18, 2021 Patrol Units were dispatched to the Quality Inn located in East Stroudsburg for a report of a theft. Patrol Officers located the reporting female victim who reported that a male acquaintance of hers knocked on her hotel room door. As she opened the door the male grabbed her by the neck, threw her on the bed and continued to choke her to the point she could not breath. The male then took her backpack to include her wallet and cell phone. The victim was able to run away. Arrest paperwork was completed by patrol.

BURGLARY

For the month of December, the Stroud Area Regional Police Department responded to 4 residential burglary calls that were reported within the member municipalities. Of these burglary reports;

- 1 occurred in Stroudsburg Borough
- 2 occurred in **Stroud Township**
- 1 occurred in East Stroudsburg Borough



For the month of December there were 4 actual residential burglaries reported. The on call Detectives were not contacted to process the scenes on the reported cases. Patrol closed out 3 cases and made an arrest on one.

UNATTENDED DEATHS


For the month of December, there was 4 unattended deaths that Detectives were notified and or responded to the scene. There was 1 suspicious death subsequently a suspected overdose. The Detective on-call responded to the scene, and the investigation is ongoing. The Detectives conducted multiple interviews, processed the scenes and are awaiting the pathology results.

The DDRD, (drug delivery resulting in death) are joint investigations with the Monroe County District Attorney's Office and County Detectives as required by the Monroe County death protocols. The investigation includes scene processing, multiple search warrants, cell phone analysis, multiple interviews and continued efforts with the County Detective to uncover additional intelligence to locate the individual that sold the narcotics to the decedent. The case is considered homicide investigations and continue to be investigated as such.

The Detective Unit was contacted on all of the above death cases and continues to work with the Monroe County District Attorney's Office and Monroe County Coroner's Office as required with equivocal deaths.

For the month of December there were 6 medical emergency overdose cases not resulting in death.

Officers on patrol also contribute to known quality of life issues in our community by providing foot patrols and keeping an eye on known "hot spots" for current violations.

December 2021:

There were no QOL patrols for the month of December.

Panhandling Complaints: SARPD received 7 panhandling complaints in December.

- 12/2/21- Chick-Fil-A, (1814hrs) Stroud Township- Male in the drive thru asking customers for money and refusing to leave. Male was removed from the property, counseled on trespass and disorderly conduct and provided information on the homeless shelter and Street2Feet program.
- **12/2/21- Fu Lay Chinese**, (1500 hrs) Stroudsburg- Report of a male and female inside the restaurant asking for money. Both individuals trespassed from the restaurant.

- **12/12/21- Main Street**, (1951 hrs) Stroudsburg- Report of 3 or 4 males asking people for money. Unable to located individuals.
- **12/16/21- Panera Bread** (1244 hrs), Stroud Township- Report of 3 females walking in the parking lot asking people for money. Unable to locate.
- 12/16/21- Red Robin/ Lowes, (1500hrs)- Stroud Township- 2 females initially in the restaurant asking for money, manager asked them to leave and they went into the Lowes parking lot. Unable to locate.
- **12/16/21- Target**, (1640 hrs) Stroud Township- Report of a male and female knocking on people's car windows asking for money. Unable to locate.
