TRAINING REPORT



Training Report August 2020



According to the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, police are expected to be more proactive and strive to prevent crime, while building relationships within the community. This is a delicate balance that is difficult to achieve and maintain. To that end, police training involves more than knowing how to pat down someone that's detained, or how to shoot a gun, it's also about listening to people, watching for trends, and preparing for outcomes. SARPD Officers maintain a high level of moral and ethical values, and will continue to achieve this through training and education.

Training



August 3rd, Sgt. Wielgus attended the online "Officer Involved Shooting" training through the Bureau of Justice Assistance.

August 4th, K-9 Officers Sampere and Britt attended their bi-weekly training in Stroudsburg, PA. This training focused on tracking, building searches, article searches and narcotic searches.

August 7th**-9**th, Officer Rui Macedo attended the Standardized Field Sobriety Testing training at the Lehigh Twp. Police Department.



August 8th, Cpl. Miller conducted training for members of the SARPD SWAT Team. This training focused on High Risk Warrant Planning

and Movement Techniques. Those members that were in attendance included Sgt. Brown, Officer Petruzzi, Officer Taylor, Cpl. Petrosino, Cpl. Eilber, Officer Labar, Det. Knowles, and Officer Capone as a role player.

August 12th, Lt. Raymond attended "Mental Health and Wellness" online training, "Recognizing Pre-Incident Indicators and Behaviors" online training and the "Foot Pursuits" online training class.

August 18th, K-9 Officers Sampere and Britt attended their bi-weekly training in Scranton, PA. This training focused on tracking, building searches, article searches and narcotic searches.

August 19th, Officer Petruzzi conducted training for the members of the SARPD SWAT Team. This training focused on the team's handgun shooting skills. Officers that were in attendance, included: Cpl. Miller, Sqt. Brown, Cpl. Petrosino, Det. Knowles, Officer Labar, Officer Taylor and Cpl. Eilber

August 19th, Sgt. Wielgus attended "Beyond the Obvious: Identifying and Investigating Asphyxiation Cases through Fox Valley Technical College.

August 20th **and 21**st, Sgt. Brown, Cpl. Miller, Officer Petruzzi and Officer Cohowicz attended the Pepperball Armorer and Instructor course. The class was conducted at the Monroe County Public Safety Center.



August 31st, Officer Petruzzi conducted remedial training for officers that failed to qualify at their yearly firearms qualification course.

During August, All SARPD Officers were re-certified in First Aid and CPR, as required by the Municipal Police Officers Training and Education Commission requires.

DETECTIVE UNIT REPORT August 2020

For the Month of August, 2020 the Detective Unit was involved in several activities within the member municipalities of Stroud Township and the Boroughs of Stroudsburg and East Stroudsburg.

Details of some of these activities follow:

MAJOR CRIMES

ASSAULTS

During the month of August, 2020 there were 5 aggravated assaults reported to the Stroud Area Regional Police Department. Of these assaults:

- 2 occurred in Stroudsburg Borough
- 1 occurred in Stroud Township
- 2 occurred in East Stroudsburg Borough

During August 2020, Patrol Units responded to five aggravated assaults. The Detective Unit was contacted and requested to assist on one aggravated assault involving a knife.

On August 20, Patrol Units were dispatched for a report of a domestic. Patrol Units arrived to a residence within the Borough of East Stroudsburg. Monroe County Control Center provided information to the Officers to include a history of domestic disturbances previously reported. Upon the Officers arrival blood was observed outside the front door. As Patrol Officers attempted to make contact with at the residence they were notified by Control Center, a male with a stab wound had just presented at Lehigh Valley Pocono Hospital.

Detective Unit notified and requested to assist with the investigation to include search warrants, processing the scene at the residence and the vehicle the victim was in. Multiple Detectives responded and continued the investigation to include multiple interviews and it was learned the male victim was dropped off by a female believed to be his wife. Conflicting accounts as to how the male sustained his injuries were given by victim and his wife. The investigation is ongoing.

SEX & FAMILY CRIMES

In August, 15 new sex crimes, and possible child abuse cases were reported to the Stroud Area Regional Police Department, 11 cases were referred to the Detective Unit for further investigation




In relation to the above assigned cases 5 were sex crimes, 10 were suspected child abuse cases.

Of the 11 cases that were assigned, 10 subsequently remain under investigation. In the majority of these open cases, the alleged perpetrators are known or have been identified through investigation. The investigations are still ongoing to determine if an actual crime was committed and if so to establish enough probable cause to make an arrest. Due to the nature of these crimes and/or the age of the victims no further information can be released at this time.

ROBBERY

For the month of August, 2020 the Stroud Area Regional Police Department did not receive any reports of robbery



BURGLARY


The Stroud Area Regional Police Department responded to 4 burglary calls that were reported within the member municipalities in the month of August, 2020. Of these Burglary reports:

- 1 occurred in Stroudsburg Borough
- 2 occurred in Stroud Township
- 1 occurred in East Stroudsburg Borough

On August 31, Stroud Area Regional Patrol Unit dispatched to Stroud Township for a report of a Burglary. Upon Officers arrival the home owner reported an unknown individual entered into his residence through a bedroom window. The home owner reported leaving his residence for an hour and returned to find the bedroom screen open and a bedroom had been "tossed". The Detective Unit was contacted by the Patrol Sergeant and requested the residence be processed.

Detectives responded, photographed and processed the scene. In addition, the Detective located video footage from a nearby building. Items removed from the home included jewelry, medications, and 2 Glock magazines loaded with 9mm rounds. The investigation is ongoing.

Patrol Units handled the remaining burglary incidents.



UNATTENDED DEATHS

During the month of August, there were 3 death cases, through investigation the 3 cases have been closed. One case has been determined to be medical. The two remaining deaths have been referred to the Detective Unit as a result of suspected suicide. The Detective Unit was contacted on all of the death cases and subsequently requested to process two scenes, conduct multiple interviews while subsequently working with the Monroe County District Attorney's Office and Monroe County Coroner's Office as required.

During the month of August there were 4 medical emergency overdose death cases not resulting in death.

NEW CASE ASSIGNMENTS



For the month of August, 34 new cases and assignments were referred to the Investigators currently staffing the Detective Unit.


August 8th -Officer Taylor escorted a save the Children March from Dansbury Park to Children and Youth center.
